Mr. Turnes is President of the New England Watercolor Society and a former Treasurer of the Copley Society of Boston. He received his B. S. Degree in art education from the University of Wisconsin, and his M. B. A. from Columbia University in New York. Mr. Turnes is a member of the North Shore Arts Association, Gloucester, and the Wellesley Society of Arts as well as others. He has exhibited in National Shows such as the Salmagundi Club, the Academic Artist Association of Springfield, the American Artists Professional League, New York, the Allied Artists of America where he received a special award, and the Smithsonian Institute Travel Show. Mr. Turnes paints in both watercolor and oil. His style is contemporary impressionism. He has had workshops with Charles Reed and Don Stone along with others. He is represented by galleries in Boston, Martha's Vineyard and by the Premier Image Gallery in Ashland. We know you will enjoy this demonstration, so please come.
