She enjoys gallery affiliations in New York, as well as Boston, and the South Shore. Ms. Pratt has been featured in the following publications; "Drawing with Pastels" by Ron Lister, Prentice-Hall, Inc. Frontispiece for "Concerning the Art of Poetry" by Wilmon Brewer, Marshall Jones Co., and is featured in the October 1984 issue of the American Artist magazine.
